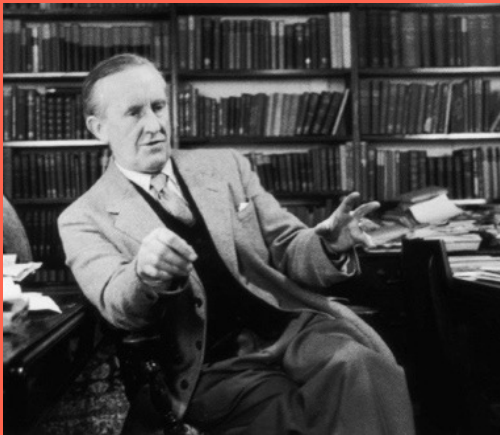
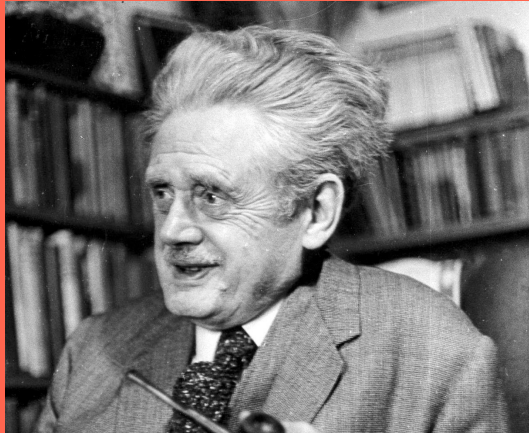
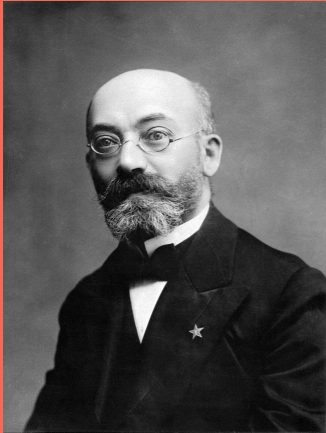

Words constantly fail us. New species, ideas, and worlds need new names. Relations break down wherever boundaries are crossed. Sometimes, the emotions we feel simply refuse to be captured by our existing languages. For more than a millennium, writers and thinkers have turned to invented languages like Esperanto, Elvish, Láadan, or Lallans – artificial systems of communication not endemic to any place, time, or people – for solutions. This course explores the construction, function, and cultural legacies of these languages. Who makes them, how, and why? How do their creations confront crises of politics and identity in their own times? What determines their success or failure?
